As a side note, I'm working with Mr. Leese to arrange a gathering in Grand Rapids at Harvey Cadillac to see his private car collection.

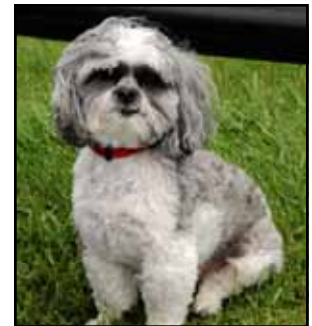
Thanks everyone for participating; we are already invited for 2010. I hope more club members can participate next year.

Food Collection Update

With the economy as it is, our Chapter has been collecting food at each of our monthly

meetings this year and donating it to a local food bank branch. The following is an update from Betsy, the food bank coordinator for the Haslett Community Church Food Bank branch, where our monthly donations are received.

We have provided food for 172 different families this year. That would not include the Christian Service personal need orders. We had the highest number of families served in July since I started with

the food bank three years ago.....75 families. I think our ideal capacity is 50 a month. The Mid Michigan Food Bank (formerly the Red Cross Food Distribution Center where we buy food for \$.18 when available or at discounted rates, just found out Meijer will no longer be sending their close dated food there. This is where we have purchased the majority of our food over the years. All of the donated food is greatly appreciated. We have been purchasing more food on sale when items are 10 for \$10. Thank you for helping us out.

Anyone who is not able to attend our monthly meeting, but would like to contribute to the Greater Lansing Area Food Bank may send a check made out to: "Haslett Community Church Food Bank", PO Box 217, Haslett, MI 48840-0217. The Haslett Community Church food bank branch is one of the larger branches serving the Lansing area.

R.E. Olds Chapter General Session Meeting August 4, 2009

She also read a letter from Debra the director of the museum explaining the extravaganza mix-up during the Homecoming show this year. There were numerous car show fliers passed around for those interested.

Board Meeting Items: There was no Board meeting this month due to no items available for discussion.

Vice Presidents Report:

Treasurers Report:

Troy Collins reported: The balance on hand as of June 30, 2009 was \$22063.31. Revenues for the month were \$541.40. Expenses for the month were \$1258.76. The balance on hand as of July 31, 2009 was \$21345.95. There was a \$13.50 service charge for depositing too much cash. This will be reimbursed by the bank. Harry Emmons moved to accept the treasurers' report as read. Wayne Mason seconded the motion. The membership approved the motion.

Special Events Budget: Homecoming has most of the bills submitted and paid. The profit was \$2268.72. When applied to the Chapter budget we are in the black \$2121.

Secretaries Report:

The minutes of the general session meeting for July 2009 were presented to the membership and opened for discussion. Mike Ross motioned to accept the minutes as read. Harry Emmons seconded the motion. The membership approved the motion.

Newsletter Report: Wayne Mason reported there are no new articles for the newsletter's next release. The next issue is September /October. There are some additional 25th anniversary patches left and available at \$3.00 a piece.

The website had 5922 unique visitors for the year. Wayne gave some statistics by month. June is a high month with 102 unique visitors the week prior to the Homecoming show. The day before the show there were over 900 on the site.

There were no expenditures approved at this meeting.

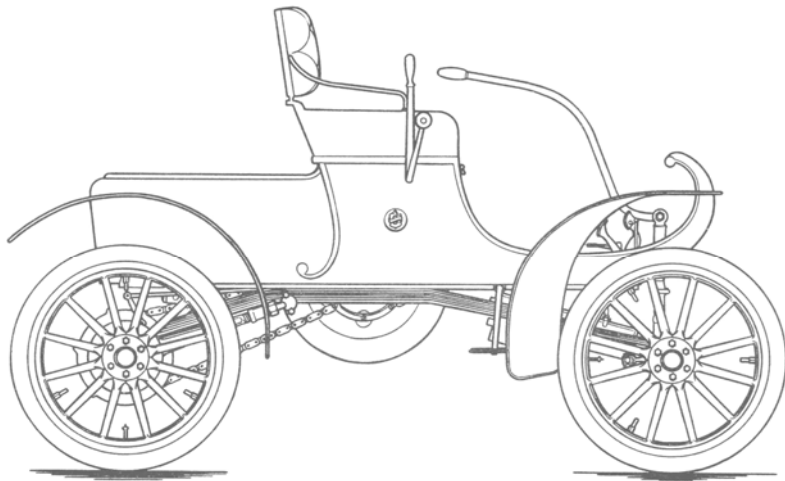
