



THE "BARNEY" OLDS

ome of the Motor City Rockets were at the 2009 Concourse d'Elegance car show this past Sunday [August 2nd] in Rochester Hills, Michigan. As we were walking around and admiring the almost forgotten pieces of rolling artwork from the early 20th century; we came across a truly oneof- a-kind Oldsmobile - a 1911 two-seat, 4-cylinder "Baby Brother" to the Limited, tagged an "Autocrat". The folks that brought it were from Oklahoma, just north of OK City. They informed us that the restoration was just completed on Monday! Sure there were lots of rare and beautiful cars on hand, but this was an Oldsmobile!


There was a very good story that went with this baby as well. The owner calls it "Barney", and he asked if we knew why; I replied "because you found it in a barn". Well I was partially right; it was originally stuck in a barn, but that was to protect it from being scrapped during World War II. A gentleman from Michigan named Barney Pollard had this in his collection of rare gems, hence the name "Barney". Here was a man with enough foresight to not only

understand the significance of rare cars, even back in the 1930's and 40's, but to hide them from planes flying reconmissions looking for scrap! Henry Ford even attempted to get the cars turned in for the war effort. But Barney stuck to

his ground, and probably guns, and planted wood poles into the ground, then mounted Rail Road Rails on top of them. From those he hoisted cars from their front bumpers! (1,200 in total) Once he had the cars in place; he built barns around them so no one could see them! The cars stayed in their cocoons until the 1970's when they were sold and auctioned

Set-up and tear-down the day of the show is lead by **Jim Brehm** and **Chris Hemminger**. Along with volunteers, they see that all tents, chairs, tables, and canopies are ready for use. At the end of day everything has to be torn down and packed up. Chris and Jim have also been known to be the pit crew for golf carts repairs.

You will find **Marsha Nicholas** at the OCA tent. She is the contact for the OCA Road show package and is responsible for obtaining our insurance coverage for the day of show.

The event contact person is myself, **Don Cooper**. Actually this is a pretty easy job. I handle questions via e-mail and telephone regarding the show, which involves about 100 to 150 contacts. The real cool part is that I get to hear everyone's Oldsmobile story, and believe me, they all have a story.

Last but not least is our Homecoming 2009 chairpersons, **Ken** and **Marsha Nicholas**, who are the glue that holds this event together. An extra load was put on Marsha this year due to Ken's medical situation and work schedule on meeting nights. The quality show that we enjoy today is a reflection of their seventeen plus years involvement with the Homecoming show.

Homecoming 2010 will mark our 18th year for the car show, and will again be co-chaired by the Nicholas's and the Cooper's. We will be alternating the committee meetings and duties throughout the year. On the day of the show, you may find one or all of us involved with any one of the tasks described above.

The committee members and all of the volunteers make Homecoming the success that our Chapter should be proud of. As co-chairs, we would like to thank committee people and volunteers for all that you do; without you there would not be an Oldsmobile Homecoming show.

omecoming 2009 is now past and has been declared a great success. An article in the chapter newsletter cannot cover all of the thanks that are deserved by the committee members and volunteers for all of the work they do for the show. Some head-of-thecommittee position changes have occurred in the last few years, and this would be a good time to let the membership know who those committee heads are that work about nine months of the year to make a successful one-day Homecoming show.

Site location and obtaining a meeting place for the committee is being handled by **John Gross**; he also obtains trophy design ideas and orders the trophies that are given out at the show.

Ron Reichle is our site layout/parking chair. Ron is in his second year at this position and has made some very good changes to the parking, and location of the show cars.

Our swap/vending area is being run by John and Betty VanderTuin from Canada. They did a great job this year and are already making changes for the 2010 show that can only make this area run better and be more efficient.

Ashley Jones works with Doug and Judy Badgley on our show posters. Ashley is also responsible for contacting the DJ for our music and also obtains advertising in many auto related magazines for the show.

Our mailing fliers are handled by **Judy Badgley**. The committee meets to layout the flier and proof-read any changes, and then Judy gets the flyers printed. In her spare time, she also researches and orders the registration gift after the group decides what to purchase. She also contacts the various Oldsmobile clubs for advertising and calls/schedules all of the volunteers to work on show day.

Doug Badgley arranges for the blow-up car, making sure it is delivered, and then picked up when we are through. He also makes sure it will run initially, and sometimes he even has to make sure it stops running.

Budget/accounting chores are left to **Troy Collins**. He handles all of the money, incoming and out going. You might say he keeps us between the "financial" lines.

The beautiful window cards, the registration packets and all other aspects of registration are done by **Ed Shand**. I wish I could explain how and what he does, but I don't understand it at all. I do know that what he does has improved our registration system beyond anything we could have expected. This year, he also found time to set-up a 50 /50 drawing and recruited his son and grand-daughter to take care of sales at Homecoming.

Food vendors and Boy Scouts of America are contacted and scheduled by **Eva Cooper**. She also handles the "Price is Right" grocery give-away game that has grown to be very popular with car owners and spouses.

If you are at the show early enough or late enough, you might see **Scott Whitaker** in a cherry picker running wires. Scott does this and makes the connections for the sound system. He also obtains our orange cones and barrels for traffic control and flow.

After a theme or feature has been decided for the next year, **Ken Nicholas** starts working with the T-shirt printer and comes up with the beautiful shirts that we enjoy every year. From the shirt design, Ken works out the design for the dash plaques and orders them also.

The day of the show Jill and Andy Gilbert, along with volunteers, work on the distribution of the pre-sold and day-of-show T-shirt sales.

Dave Violetta shops nearly year around obtaining great door prizes which we give out the day of the show. He looks for as many bargains as he can find. I'm not sure if he likes to shop, or just likes to spend other people's money. Whatever his reason is, he comes up with some high- quality items.

Wayne Mason is the King of the Rentals. If we rent it, Wayne gets it: tables, chairs, golf carts, tents, dumpster, etc. He even has some items locked in for our 2010 show.

Newspaper, radio, and television coverage comes from the fine efforts of **Steve Zabin**. He also is our auctioneer the day of the show. Every year Steve asks for donations from the membership, and he also asks vendors in the swap area to donate an item to be sold at auction.

The site clean up crew is lead by **Harry Emmons**. Harry works with the chapter volunteers and the Boy Scouts to be sure that the site is as good as, or better than it was before the show.

1. There were 280 Show Car participants pre-registered. Of the 280 preregistered 28 did not show for Homecoming. There were 138 show cars registered at the gate. There were 79 first time participants or they haven't been at a homecoming for three years. Registration sheets were pre-printed for all participants who attended the 2006 through 2008 homecoming show. This aided with the gate registration process as the participant did not have to fill out a form for registration. Those registering at the gate received an envelope with a blank dash card for them to fill out after registering, a dash plague and the door prize ticket and game cards. The envelope packets were sequentially numbered so a rolling count of the show cars could be maintained throughout the day. In addition to the show cars there were 30 cars for sale. 13 were pre-registered and 17

registered at the gate. The total number of cars at the show was 448 or down a total of 40 cars from 2008. There were cars registered from 21 different States and Canada. Three cars came from California, nine from Canada and others from the East and West coast. We had 54 vendors pre-registered reserving 114. On the show day there were an additional 14 vendors registered making a total of 68 vendors registering 128 spaces. This compares to 76 vendors securing 134 swap meet spaces for 2008. All of the pre-registration workers did an outstanding job keeping up with the traffic and did a flawless job identifying those who needed to complete the registration form and those of which a form was preprinted.


